

In an effort to keep recycling expenses to a minimum, the drop-off method of recycling is the most economical way of collection and achieves the same goals as curbside recycling. Curbside programs are very expensive to start-up and operate and can result in user fees and/or increased taxes.

### NEWSPAPERS, MAGAZINES, PHONE BOOKS AND CARDBOARD

Use the following convenient locations to dispose of newspapers, magazines, phone books, office & copy paper and cardboard.

There are 2 separate containers at each location. One is for the newspapers, magazines and phone books, office & copy paper and the other is for flattened cardboard. **Please do not mix cardboard with the paper products.**

### USED OIL, ANTIFREEZE AND USED AUTO AND TRUCK BATTERIES

Deliver these items to the Town of Greeneville Public Works Dept. at 708 W. Summer St. or the Greeneville-Greene County Transfer Station and Demolition Landfill at 1555 Old Stage Road. Hours of operation are 7:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. Monday – Friday. Closed on holidays. Landfill is closed for lunch from 11:45 a.m. - 12:15 p.m.

### METALS - APPLIANCES

Any type of metal or appliance will be picked up on an on-call basis. Call the Public Works Department at 638-6152.

### OTHER ITEMS TO RECYCLE:

Plastic grocery bags – most grocery stores have a drop-off container for the recycling of plastic bags or ask for paper bags and use them to collect your paper items for recycling. Or go green and carry your own reusable bags. Ink cartridges and cell phone batteries can be recycled at local computer and office supply stores.

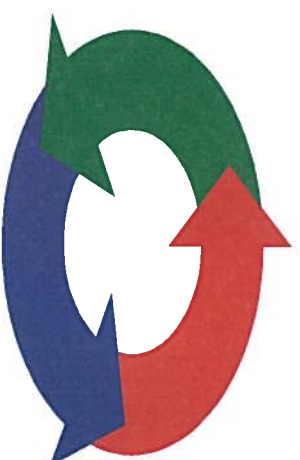

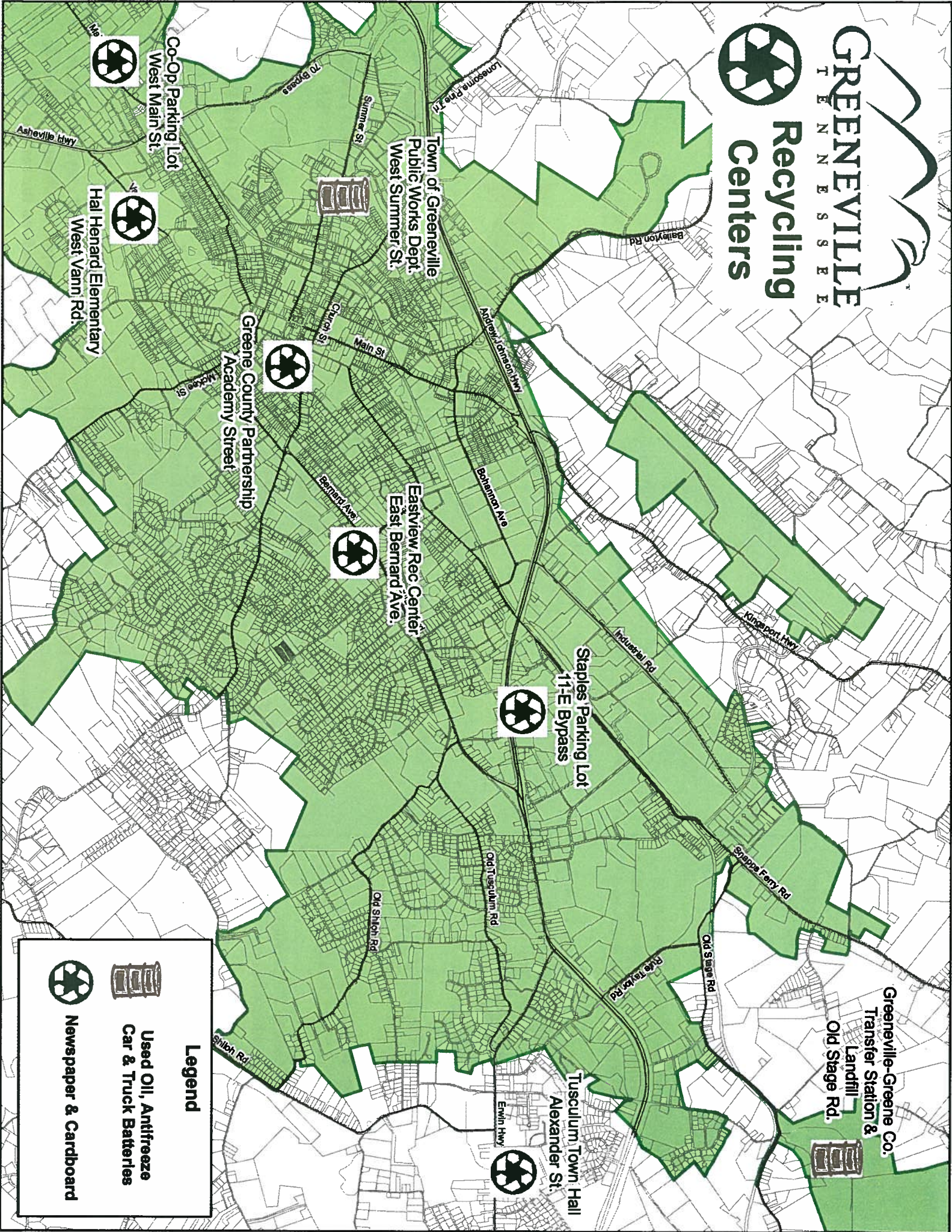
